History: This is a 50 year old male who was hospitalized in the intensive care unit at Evanston Hospital, (in network) from 02/11/06 to 02/23/06 with congestive heart failure sepsis, and pyelonephropathy. He is obese at 495 pounds, and has a history of hypertension. He was treated with IV medications and required a ventilator for breathing assistance. He was eventually weaned from the ventilator, but continued to require the use of a BiPap at night. As of 2/23/06 the patient required stand by assistance with ambulation and supervision for transfers.

On 2/23/06 he was discharged to his parent's home for assistance. He was provided with a BiPap machine, heated humidifier, mask, cannula, headgear, tubing, filters, oxygen, and a heavy duty wheeled walker through Homelink.

He also had two skilled nursing visits on 2/24/06 and 03/03/06, and one home physical therapy visit on 2/27/06, through Homelink

He followed up with his physician on 03/02/06 and was released to return to work part time. He no longer required continuous oxygen. He has stabilized on the BiPap machine, and has indicated he accepts this will be long term use unless a change in lifestyle is made.

Case Management Intervention:

- This referral was initially received on 02/21/06 to review the medical necessity of inpatient rehab and to provide assistance with discharge planning.
- Communication was established with the discharge planner. Clinical information was reviewed and subacute inpatient rehab did not appear appropriate. Suggestion was made for home health services in lieu of the subacute inpatient rehab stay.
- Assistance was provided in making arrangements for home health services and durable medical equipment through Homelink.

- Verified with the account case manager, acceptance of Homelink reviewing sleep study and for BiPap needs.
- Contact was established and maintained with Homelink regarding the home services. Request was made by the provider for four additional skilled nursing and six additional physical therapy visits, and the provider was advised that these would not be recommended as the patient was no longer homebound and wanted to return to work part time. Continued rental services for durable medical equipment now to be followed by the account case manager, per the account directive.
- Follow up was performed with the physician regarding the patient's condition and treatment plans.
- Communication was established and maintained with the patient who has been kept apprised of case management activities and recommendations.

Case Management Recommendations:

- 02/23/06, durable medical equipment arranged through Homelink for BiPap rent to purchase with and including oxygen, tubing etc. for continued treatment at home is medically appropriate. Account case manager will continue to follow.
- 02/24/06 and 03/03/06, 2 skilled nursing visits arranged through Homelink were medically appropriate.
- 02/27/06, one home physical therapy visit was arranged through Homelink and was medically appropriate.
- Sleep study to be reviewed by Homelink.
- This writer will close this file as services are no longer indicated.
